



Assessment of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Students

Mental health professionals often describe the challenges experienced with assessing culturally and linguistically diverse (CLD) children and adolescents. Based on research evidence, Dr. Esther Geva will debunk the myths which guide the conceptual foundation of assessment for these children. Dr. Geva will then briefly discuss the issues pertaining to the administration and interpretation of informal tasks designed to assess oral language, literacy, and cognitive skills. This will also include a discussion surrounding culture and acculturation and the communication of results of an assessment. A case study will be used to illustrate the diagnostic process.


